Why is it important to understand Hebrews 7?

The canvas of the OT: Genesis 14:18-20 & Psalm 110:4

- 1. Jesus Christ is no ordinary **high priest** (5:6,10; 6:20; 7:11-17).
- 2. Jesus Christ combines the offices of **Ring and priest** (7:1-2).
- 3. Jesus Christ is the Son of God (7:3).
 - 4. Jesus Christ serves **permanently** as our high priest (7:3, 17, 24)

5. Jesus Christ *guarantees the Win*; this is no fantasy! (7:22-25; 8:1)

NOTES FOR PERSONAL & SMALL GROUP STUDY

1 KEEPING IT REAL

How would you describe a famous person without using their familiar name, but rather their character, accomplishments, nicknames and titles?

> LOOK AT THE BOOK

Read Genesis 14:18-20 and Psalm 110 (especially v. 4). What do the qualities and titles mentioned reveal about this person named Melchizedek?

- What are the similarities between Melchizedek and Jesus Christ? Read Revelation 21:6; Hebrews 5:8-10, 7:1-3; Matthew 26:26-28; Isaiah 9:6-7. Many scholars believe that Melchizedek is a "Christophany" (a pre-incarnate manifestation of Christ). What do you think?
- What other names for Christ do you know? For example, think of the "I Am's" in the Gospel of John.

TAKING IT FURTHER

Meditate on and pray the different names of Jesus. Try using the different names in conversation with your friends. If you need help, *The Navigators* have a 30-day prayer plan with a different name each day. Google "The names of Jesus Navigators."
