### KEEPING IT REAL

Describe a trial or struggle that was too big for you to handle on your own.

### > LOOK AT THE BOOK

Paul opens his discussion about a thorn in the flesh with, "Because of the surpassing greatness of the revelations..." (2 Corinthians 12:7). Discuss whether the surpassing greatness of the revelations was unique to Paul's experience or has general application among believers.

In Psalm 31:9-13, David speaks of distress, grief, sorrow, a body wasting away, being a reproach and an object of dread, forgotten as a dead man. Read Psalm 31 and discuss David's confession amidst his struggles.

### **TAKING IT FURTHER**

In whatever trials or struggles you are facing at the moment, confess Jesus as your refuge, strength and source of hope over those trials and struggles.
