Paul often writes about marriage. Here's what he says about being single: (1 Corinthians 7:1-2, 5-9, 17, 25-28, 32-35, 37-38)

- 1. Being single is a *good gift*. (7:7-9)
- Being single is *not an inferior status*, (7:7, 17, 26, 37-38)
- 3. Being single *insulates you from marital* struggle. (7:25-28)
- 4. Being single provides unique freedom. (7:32-35)
- 5. Being single may be for *a lifetime or simply for a season*. (7:36-40)
- 6. Being single, the goal is **the same**

Three examples:

THE **ONE THING:** *Enjoy your gift!*
