KEEPING IT REAL

Remember a time when you were uncomfortable, but still did something you believed God had called you to do. What about a time that you shared your faith story and the gospel, even when it was out of your comfort zone?

LOOK AT THE BOOK

2 Read Acts 10 and explore the details of the story from both Cornelius's and Peter's perspectives, asking "why" after each verse. Conclude with these questions: Why is it important that Cornelius ends his testimony by telling Peter, "We are all here in the presence of God to listen to everything that Lord has commanded you to tell us"? Why are the results of Peter's testimony so important to us today?

"Wanted" is the name of this sermon series. Last week, we looked at living the Christian life in such a way that our lifestyle would be attractive and would inspire others who do not believe. This week, we're considering what comes before authentically living that lifestyle: "Here am I"...available and willing. How important is this "living an attractive life"? How does Acts 10 proclaim the message of being "Wanted"?

TAKING IT FURTHER

"Hineni"refers not to a physical location but the location of the heart. What steps can you take to reflect Hineni (Here am I) to those you meet?
