What are you waiting for, hoping for, perhaps beginning to doubt will ever happen? How are you dealing with the wait?

LOOK AT THE BOOK

- 2 Waiting for what we earnestly desire is not easy for any of us. How did the following handle their long waits for a child: Abraham and Sarah (Genesis 15:2-8, 16:1-5, 17:15-20, 18:9-15); Rachel (Genesis 30:1-3); and Hannah (1 Samuel: 9-17).
- Waiting permeates the story of God's people. The Psalms give us pointers on how to wait well. What do you learn from these verses: Psalms 5:3, 27:13-14, 33:20-22, 40:1-3, 130:5-6?
