Lamentations

WHAT IS A LAMENT?

- "to weep bitterly" "to mourn out loud" "to cry out" "wail"
- It is **unstoppable** in its timing and **inconsolable** in its power!

SETTING:

- Book of Jeremiah → Destruction of Jerusalem → Book of Lamentations
- Watch for these phrases:
 "There is no one to comfort" (1:1-2, pp. 179-181)
 "Look, Lord!" (1:9-11, pp.180-181; p. 186, 2:20)
 "The Lord did this!" (1:5, p. 179)

LESSONS

- God wants us to express our grief which is <u>real</u>, <u>raw</u> and <u>unavoidable</u>.
- 2. God is always **faithful** and **just**. (3:19-24)
- 3. We live in this ongoing **tension**. (5:21-22)
- 4. We must never forget that the **end will come**. (1:9 & Jeremiah 5:30-31)
- THE**ONE THING:** <u>Jesus cares for you, so you can be utterly honest with Him</u>.
