Ecclesiastes

While we recognize the practical truths of individual statements, what is the Teacher really trying to say?

- "Everything is meaningless" 1:1-11 (p. 271-272)
- "Under the sun"
- · Death confirms the meaninglessness of life
- It appears that the goal of the writer is that you will find yourself so

dissatisfied with life that you will begin to search for what really brings **meaning** to life.

Our frustration is this: We know deep within ourselves that life is to have

meaning, but we also know that we cannot **discover what it is!** [3:9-12 (p.274); 7:14 (p.280); 8:17 (p.283) & 11:5 (p.286)]

So after examining life from every angle, turning it over and over in our hands, even taking it to the extreme, we end with the same **verdict** as the writer (1:2)

Then how are we supposed to live our lives in light of this verdict?

THEONE THING: Fear God & obey Him
