### Here's what you are to look for in the Chronicles:

- 1. Look for the big story line by looking for big names.
- 2. Note that the emphasis is exclusively on the line of David.
- 3. Watch for the major faith lessons.
  - a. Solomon → "Will God really dwell on earth with humans?" p.419 (2 Chronicles 6:18)

### Lesson: God's plan has always been to live among His people!

B. Rehoboam → "He abandoned the Law of the LORD."
p.427 (2 Chronicles 12:1)

Lesson: <u>Once we are established and strong in our faith, our greatest</u> <u>temptation will be to abandon the Word precisely because we are so</u> familiar with it.

Jehoshaphat → "I can tell him only what my God says" p.433 (2 Chronicles 18:13)

Lesson: Truth has never been and will be determined by consensus

 Manasseh → the most wicked king in the history of the people of God p. 456 (2 Chronicles 33)

Lesson: God's amazing grace always responds to genuine repentance!

e. Josiah  $\rightarrow$  "I have found the Book." p.458 (2 Chronicles 34)

Lesson: <u>Rediscovering the Word of God (which cannot be destroyed)</u> and living in obedience to it, leads to revival.

4. Pay attention to the ending ("aliyah").
