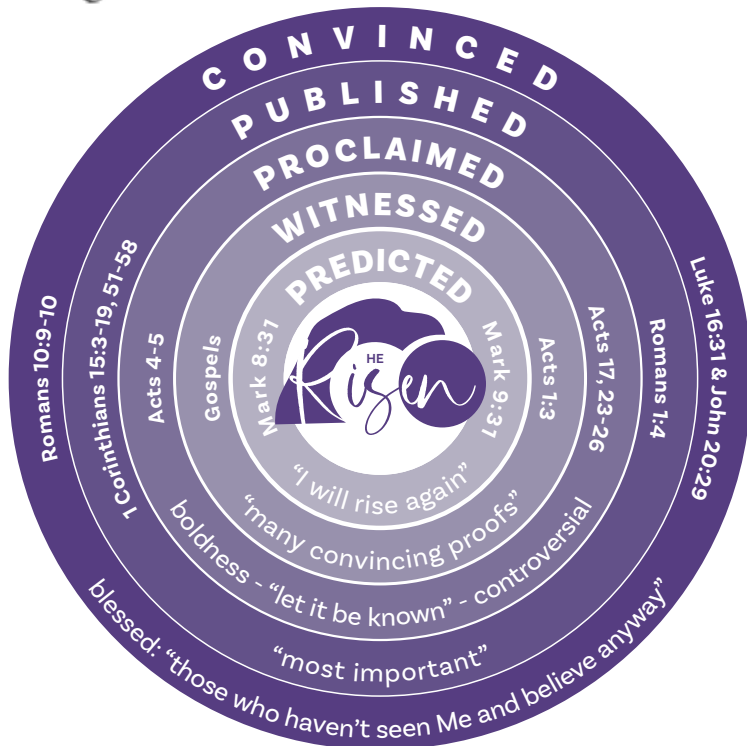




Resurrection!

The bodily resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead:

1. Proves who **He is** (Romans 1:4).
2. Explains what He did and said (John 20:30-31).
3. Declares why **He came** (Luke 19:10 & John 3:16).
4. Confirms where He came from (John 9:29-33; 19:9).
5. Tells how He **saves** (Romans 4:24-25).
6. Predicts He **will return** (John 14:3).

KEEPING IT REAL

1 Describe a time when you have asked someone, or they have asked you, to prove something. What did it take to convince you? Did you convince them? Explain.

LOOK AT THE BOOK

2 How convinced were the disciples when they first heard reports that Jesus had risen from the dead? How would you describe what it took to convince you? Briefly share your faith story.

3 Jesus tells a powerful story in Luke 16:19-31 about life after death. The request by the rich man is so appropriate yet Abraham denies it. Why? What is the point Jesus is trying to make about life and about Himself?
